THE POWER OF QUALITY IMPROVEMENT PROMOTING HEALTH EQUITY THROUGH RYAN WHITE PART A SERVICES

In this third annual Power of QI conference our organizing theme focuses on the broad goal of promoting health equity. While health equity often seems an idealistic concept, there are actual examples to be found in the work of our colleagues in the NY EMA. Ryan White Part A providers have been promoting health equity for as long as they have been engaged in providing services for people living with HIV. In the NY EMA, providers are working to address the immediate consequences of stigma, bias, disparities, food insecurity, social injustice, and discrimination; the projects presented at this conference demonstrate many such efforts in the context of quality improvement.

As we think about ways to achieve health equity, we should acknowledge the transformative effects that HIV social service providers have brought to the healthcare delivery system, bringing together supportive and medical providers, breaking down barriers between preventive and clinical services, linking medical and behavioral health models to the public health system, all of which were undertaken to address the needs of people with HIV. And we should note that the best teachers in these endeavors have been the peers who live with these challenges; we continue to learn from the experiences of patients. In the spirit of promoting health equity throughout communities of New York City and Tricounty, Part A providers have reached beyond clinical settings and promoted quality healthcare at all stages along the care continuum. Because of these remarkable accomplishments, ending the epidemic in New York is within our reach.

In these conferences, providers have shared what has been achieved in RW programs, applying quality improvement methods to improve care together, to end the epidemic, and now to promote health equity. The improvement projects included in the 14 poster and 21 workshop presentations at this conference show that public health change often begins in small settings, can be addressed by one program and may initially affect just a handful of patients. Each quality presentation shown today represents the collaborative efforts of those who sought to push their programs further and identified areas to improve, tested them, and learned from the results. They demonstrate the ways we can all build on the successful activities which our colleagues initiate, pointing us in directions we need to explore.

Therefore, this program is intended not only to reflect today's activities, but also to be used as a reference in our work going forward. This program contains the presentations and contact information of your colleagues who shared their work at this conference. Health equity may be a broad aspirational goal, but it can be reached by improving care in each program, for one patient at a time.
